ANNOUNCEMENT CONCERNING SCHOOL MASSES: Due to recent events and in close consultation between the St.

Peter School administration, Fr. Patti, the Diocesan Education Office, our Safety & Security Coordinator and local law enforcement, it has been decided that the main entrance of the church will be locked during school liturgies. Once Mass begins at the scheduled time, the main entrance (which till now has been the only unlocked entrance) will be locked. Attendees to school Masses on Fridays and Holy Days are kindly asked to arrive at least 5 minutes before Mass start times. Should anyone arrive after the door is locked, please proceed to the Rectory office to ask the Rectory staff to alert our school staff in the church who will then allow access to that person or persons.

This step is not taken lightly. Please know that it is made out of a deep responsibility to protect our students, school families and parishioners while we celebrate the Mass together. Many schools have cut off access to school Masses to anyone outside of the school students and staff. It is our hope to not have to go to this extreme as our Masses are enjoyed by families and parishioners alike. While this measure may feel different, it allows us to maintain a safe and prayerful environment, balancing our call to gather as a congregation with our duty to keep our community and the children of our families secure. Saint Pio - Feast Day, September 23rd. He was born Francesco Forgione, on May 25, 1887, in Pietrelcina, Italy. He is known for his piety, humility, and devotion. He also had the gift of the stigmata (marks similar to those left on Jesus' body by the Crucifixion) and the ability to bilocate. As a Capuchin monk and priest, he suffered physical ailments but spent most of his time advising the faithful. He offered the Sacrament of Confession often, sometimes for days at a time. Padre Pio died on September 23rd, 1968 and his funeral was attended by over 100,000 people. "Pray, hope, and don't worry." - Saint Pio

HUNGARIAN PICNIC - Holy Family Parish in Hooversville (Somerset County) will be hosting their "Magyar Bucsu' or Hungarian Picnic on Saturday, September 27th from 5PM until 8PM at the Hooversville Picnic Grove (807 Barn Street). Mass will be celebrated at 4PM. The picnic includes live music by Gypsy George Bayti and the Gypsy Stringz Orchestra, Hungarian folk dancing, basket raffles, games of chance, beer/wine/soft drinks, and food. Food includes goulash, hurka, kolbasz, chicken paprikash, potato pancakes, thick pork chops slow roasted around a fire, and more. All are welcome to celebrate the Hungarian heritage of Hooversville's miners and Holy Family Parish.

DIOCESAN PILGRIMAGE BUS TRIP TO

WASHINGTON DC - An ordinary Jubilee Year is celebrated only every 25 years. Making a pilgrimage to obtain a plenary Indulgence to either enter through a Holy Door designated by the Pope or visiting a Holy Site named by a local bishop is a very important foundation of the Jubilee tradition. For some of us this may be our last Jubilee! The National Shrine of the Immaculate Conception of the Blessed Virgin Mary was named as an official Holy Site by the United States Catholic Conference of Bishops in November 2024. There are only Holy Doors in Rome. The Diocese of Altoona Johnstown has contracted 14 buses for our own local Jubilee Pilgrimage, as most of us will not be able to go to Rome. The trip to the Basilica of the National Shrine of the Immaculate Conception in Washington, DC is on Friday, October 17, 2025. The day will include a tour of the Shrine, confessions and 2PM Mass with Bishop Mark Bartchak in the Upper Church. You can purchase a basic lunch at the shrine Cafeteria or bring a lunch. There will be a rest stop on the way to Washington and a dinner stop on the way back home. The dinner cost is on your own. Reservations and paid bus fee will continue up to September 26th. Please add your name and phone number again. The cost of the trip is \$50.00 per person, which includes the gratuity for the driver. The bus will leave at 7AM from the St. Peters Parking Lot. DIOCESAN PRIESTS' MEDICAL & RETIREMENT

COLLECTION - Priests guide the faithful through our spiritual journey, sharing in our most important milestones, from Baptism to the day we are called home to the Lord. By showing your thanks for their dedication, you can make sure our priests are supported through their retirement years. Our retired priests receive a modest retirement pension, funded primarily by parish assessment, and take on their own housing and living expenses. Many graciously continue to serve parishes amid a shortage of active priests, celebrating Mass and visiting the sick and homebound. Your generous support allows the diocese to support our senior priests, such as Msgr. Tomaselli, while keeping increases in the parish's assessment for priests' medical care and retirement needs to a minimum. Above all, your gift to this annual collection shows your appreciation for the dedication of our priests. Thank you.

TRIDUUM TO ST THERESE – September 29th, 30th & October 1st - Join us for three days of prayer to honor St Therese, and draw closer to God. There will be Mass on Monday, Tuesday and Wednesday evening at 7PM. Communal Anointing of the Sick will be held on Monday evening. This Sacrament gives healing, strength and the grace of Jesus Christ to its afflicted members. Any Catholic who is seriously ill, weakened by old age, chronically ill, or facing surgery, should receive this Sacrament.

DEAR PARISHIONERS, There will be a second collection to secure funds for building maintenance projects. The sum total of the costs for the following projects are estimated at \$122,000. These projects are:

1.Roof Repairs: The slate roofs on our Church, Hall and Rectory are aging and are missing several slate tiles and ridge caps. The roofs are over 50 years old, and we are doing our best to extend their life. The cost to repair the roofs and to install heat tracing in the gutters is \$25,000.

2. Church Pavers: \$6,700 COMPLETED

3. Parking Lot. The parking lot needs some pavement repairs and resealed. The estimated cost for this work is \$22,000. COMPLETED

- **4. Hall Air Conditioners:** We are proposing to replace the existing units with two high efficiency units at a cost of \$14,400.
- **5. School Boilers:** We had to replace the boilers in the school this past winter. One boiler was replaced at a cost of \$18,000, and \$36,000 is still needed for the two remaining boilers, for a total cost of \$54,000.

We are conducting second collections to raise money for the repairs. Our Parish has always been very generous in supporting the needs of our Church and we hope you will be as generous as your means permit. Thank you!

FUNDS RAISED: \$.65,340. (We are over half way there!)
