

SUNDAY, OCTOBER 26TH PASTOR'S NOTES:

ST PETER FORTY HOURS - On Nov. 2nd, 3rd, and 4th, our parish will celebrate the beautiful Eucharistic devotion of Forty Hours. This devotion is a special forty-hour period of prayer made before the Blessed Sacrament in solemn exposition. The number "forty" has always signified a sacred period of time: the rains during the time of Noah lasted 40 days and 40 nights; the Jews wandered in the desert for 40 years; Our Lord fasted and prayed for 40 days before beginning His public ministry, and the 40 Hours Devotion remembers that traditional "forty-hour period" from Our Lord's burial until the resurrection. The Forty Hours Devotion provides an opportunity for the spiritual growth of each person and the parish as a whole. Plan to join us in this special devotion. Each hour you spend with Jesus will deepen His Divine Peace in your heart.

EVENING DEVOTIONS BEGIN AT 7PM Sunday night - Evening Prayer and Benediction Monday night - Evening Prayer and Benediction Tuesday night - Mass, Procession and Benediction

HEALING MASS - Holy Spirit Ministry will hold a special Healing Mass on Tues., Nov. 4th, at 7PM, at St Michael Church, Hollidaysburg. This powerful night of hope and healing is for all who are suffering physically, emotionally, and spiritually. Fr. Jeremy Mohler will be the main celebrant. Praise and worship will precede the Mass at 6:30PM, and prayer ministry will follow the Mass. If you are suffering physically, or from an addiction, or hurting or struggling in any way, come and experience the healing power of Jesus and be set free! All are welcome!

THE DIVINE PRAISES - The Divine Praises, as they originally appeared, were written by Fr. Luigi Felici, S.J. in 1797, as a way to make reparation for blasphemies against the divine name. The Catechism of the Catholic Church says that "Blasphemy...consists in uttering against God - inwardly or outwardly - words of hatred, reproach, or defiance; in speaking ill of God, in failing in respect toward Him in one's speech, in misusing God's name." (CCC 2148) As a way of making amends for the blasphemies of his day, Fr. Felici composed the Divine Praises, in which God, Jesus Christ, Our Lady, the angels and the saints are praised through a succession of prayers beginning with "Blessed be." Originally there were only a handful of verses, as recorded in one of its earliest forms in the Raccolta, a book containing prayers and pious exercises to which the Popes have attached indulgences. In 1801, Pope Pius VII, granted an indulgence for the recitation of the Divine Praises. Over the years, various Popes have added six more praises. Each verse added by a Pontiff was done so in response to a particular devotion that the Pope wanted to highlight, or to a doctrine recently clarified. Pope St. Pius IX, 1854, declared the Immaculate Conception, a dogma of the Church. (Records seem to indicate that the Immaculate Conception was part of the original Divine Praises written in 1797.) **Pope Leo XIII, 1899,** consecrated the world to the Sacred Heart. Blessed be His Most Sacred Heart. **Pope Benedict XV, 1920,** wrote Bonum Sane on the anniversary of St. Joseph being declared patron of the Church. Blessed be Saint Joseph, her most chaste Spouse. **Pope Pius XII, 1952,** in 1950 declared the Assumption of Mary a dogma of the Church. Blessed be her glorious Assumption. Pope St. John XXIII, 1960, promoted devotion to the Precious Blood of Christ. Blessed be His Most Precious Blood. **Pope Paul VI, 1964,** wrote Ecclesiam Suam, focusing on the Church and the role of the Holy Spirit. Blessed be the

Holy Spirit, the Paraclete.

The Divine Praises (as prayed today)

Blessed be God.
Blessed be His Holy Name.
Blessed be Jesus Christ, true God and true man.
Blessed be His Most Sacred Heart.
Blessed be His Most Precious Blood.
Blessed be Jesus in the Most Holy Sacrament of the Altar.
Blessed be the Holy Spirit, the Paraclete.
Blessed be the great Mother of God, Mary Most Holy.
Blessed be her Holy and Immaculate Conception.
Blessed be her Glorious Assumption.
Blessed be the name of Mary, Virgin and Mother.
Blessed be Saint Joseph, her Most Chaste Spouse.

DEAR PARISHIONERS, There will be a second collection to secure funds for building maintenance projects. The sum total of the costs for the following projects is \$122,000.

1 Poof Papairs: The slate roofs on our Church, Hall and

- **1.Roof Repairs:** The slate roofs on our Church, Hall and Rectory are aging and are missing several slate tiles and ridge caps. The cost to repair the roofs and to install heat tracing in the gutters is \$25,000.
- 2. Church Pavers: \$6,700 COMPLETED
- **3. Parking Lot**. Pavement repairs and resealed are needed. Total cost for this work is \$22,000. COMPLETED
- **4. Hall Air Conditioners:** Replace the existing units with two high efficiency units at a cost of \$14,400.
- **5. School Boilers:** We had to replace the boilers in the school. One boiler was replaced at a cost of \$18,000 and \$36,000 is still needed for the two remaining boilers, for a total cost of \$54,000.

Our Parish has always been very generous in supporting the needs of our Church and we hope you will be as generous as your means permit. Thank you! FUNDS RAISED: \$82,135
