
CONFESSIONS: 2:45PM Sat. or upon request.

SUNDAY, DECEMBER 7TH PASTOR'S NOTES:

IMMACULATE CONCEPTION - MONDAY, DEC 8
December 8th is a HOLY DAY of OBLIGATION. This feast commemorates the Patroness of the United States, who gave birth to Jesus, the Incarnate Word of God, and who was immaculate herself from the first moment of her conception. Once again, America turns to Our Lady under the title of the Immaculate Conception asking her intercession to watch over and protect our country. Masses will be celebrated on Monday at 7AM, 11:15AM & 7PM.

PRIESTS FOR THE FUTURE - Bishop Bartchak would like to remind us to prayerfully consider participating in our diocese's Vocation Appeal this weekend. Over the last few years, our diocese has had too few seminarians to replace our retiring priests, which poses an urgent need for our prayer and action. To ensure our parishes have priests for the future, our diocese's Vocation Office has developed a robust plan to promote vocations to the priesthood by reaching out to young men and inviting them to consider the priesthood, which includes:

- A newly formed Vocation Team with 5 priests in different regions of the diocese who are committed to offering mentorship to young men as they discern their vocations.
 Our recent Called by Name campaign, which has already connected the Vocation Team with many incredible young men who may be open to the priesthood. So far, we have received over 200 submissions, and expect more as cards arrive in the mail.
- · Discernment Retreats & In-Person Events
- · Regional Priesthood Discernment Groups that are being held throughout the diocese to help teens and young adults learn about the priesthood and discernment. Dozens of young men are already participating.
- young men are already participating.
 Fr. Brian Norris's appointment as Vocation Recruiter, expanding the outreach of Fr. Peter Crowe (Vocations Director) and the Vocation Team.
- · Revamping communications and marketing to reach more young men.
- · Creating a new website with discernment resources that will be the communications hub for our new efforts: ajvocations.org.

Personally accompanying men as they discern their vocations. We are planning an array of Discernment Events, Retreats, and more to support young men in person, all while building much needed community.

Our Vocation Team's overall strategy is to identify and accompany young men as they discern God's call. Bishop Bartchak is asking all parishioners to be especially generous to this weekend's Vocation Appeal. You can also learn more and make a gift by visiting ajvocations.org/give.

Why do we light candles on wreaths during Advent? - Advent wreaths are a time-honored tradition and are rich in symbolism. The wreath is an ancient symbol of victory, in this case, paying tribute to Christ's victory over sin. The circular shape of the wreath reminds us that God is eternal; he – like his everlasting love for us - has no beginning and no end. The wreath is usually made of evergreen branches, symbolizing everlasting life. Traditionally, the four candles (three violet, one rose) represent the four thousand years between the fall of Adam and Eve and the birth of Christ. Each week an additional candle is lit, accompanied by Scriptural meditations and prayers. The three violet candles stand for the prayers, penances, and good works we do to prepare for Christ's coming. The rose candle is lit on the third Sunday of Advent as a reminder to rejoice, because it tells us the season is almost over. Finally, the progression

(CONT.) of the candles symbolizes the light of Jesus' arrival, which brought us out of the darkness of sin. Let your Advent wreath become the center around which your household gathers together each night during this joyous, but sometimes hectic, season of celebration. As you celebrate with the Advent wreath, include your favorite Advent hymns and songs, scripture readings and prayers focusing of Christ's threefold Advent – past, present and future.

ADVENT PRAYER:

Help us, Lord Jesus, to hold steadfast to prayer, relying on the Word of God, in all our joys and sorrows, that our hopes in You will ever increase, while our doubts and fears slowly decrease. Help us, Lord, to be a light of hope to those who are in need. To be an example of Your love and mercy, and to tell others of Your great grace and glory. Amen.

DEAR PARISHIONERS, The second collection will be for the building fund. The sum total of the costs for the following projects is \$122,000.

1.Roof Repairs: The slate roofs on our Church, Hall and Rectory are aging and are missing several slate tiles and ridge caps. The cost to repair the roofs and to install heat tracing in the gutters is \$25,000. COMPLETED

- 2. Church Pavers: \$6,700 COMPLETED
- 3. Parking Lot. Pavement repairs and resealed are needed. Total cost for this work is \$22,000. COMPLETED
- **4. Hall Air Conditioners:** Replace the existing units with two high efficiency units at a cost of \$14,400.
- **5. School Boilers:** We had to replace the boilers in the school. One boiler was replaced at a cost of \$18,000 and \$36,000 is still needed for the two remaining boilers, for a total cost of \$54,000. COMPLETED \$122,000

Our Parish has always been very generous in supporting the needs of our Church and we hope you will be as generous as your means permit. Thank you! FUNDS RAISED: \$91,829.
