#### STATIONS OF THE CROSS

Tradition holds that Mary, the mother of Jesus, set up stone markers at her home outside Jerusalem to prayerfully retrace the steps of her son's Passion? Today, praying The Stations of the Cross is one of the most simple, yet powerful, ways to prayerfully walk alongside Jesus and encounter him like never before. It is a powerful way to contemplate, and enter into, the mystery of Jesus' gift of himself to us. (Offered at 7:00 PM on Sunday evening and on Mondays at 12:15 during Lent.) The Stations of the Cross, also known as the Via Dolorosa, is a narration of the final hours in the life of Jesus Christ on earth that continues to provide spiritual conviction for every Christian and application to our lives. We can have complete hope that suffering and death have no complete hold on us. We will all share eternal life with him, if we can fall into the hands of the same Loving God. And, along the way, we are not alone. Jesus is with us as one who knows our suffering, and the death we face. That can be deeply consoling. Pray the Stations of the Cross individually: If you can't attend a Stations of the Cross service, you can always pray them on your own. You can visit a church in your own time or even reflect from your own home. For each station, follow the following steps: First, name the Station, read the opening prayer: We adore you, O Christ, and we praise you. (Kneel) Because by your holy cross you have redeemed the world. (Rise) If you are unable to kneel, you can sit or stand. (Cont.)

Next, read the selected Scripture passage for inspiration. Then, reflect and consider what this Station of the Cross means for your life. End by praying the Our Father, Hail Mary, and Glory Be. Repeat this process for all fourteen stations and you'll be amazed at how the story of Jesus' passion impacts your day! It has been said that after Mass, Adoration, and saying the Rosary, The Stations of the Cross may be the next most important contemplation we as Catholics may do! It is not only reserved for Lent!
